The Reality is....

- Many boys and girls grow up dreaming of playing sports in college and the pro ranks. But of the nearly eight million students currently participating in high school athletics in the United States, only 460,000 of them will compete at NCAA schools. And of that group, only a fraction will realize their goal of becoming a professional athlete.
- According to the NCAA of all the players participating in high school only:
 - 6.9% baseball players will play in college
 - 3.4% of men's basketball
 - 3.8% of women's basketball
 - 6.5% of football players
 - 5.7% of soccer players

College Recruitment is not a Perfect Science



The Recruiting Process is Constantly Evolving

The next 4-5 years this process is going to look very different.

Two Major Reasons:

1. Covid-19

- a. College athletes received an extra year to participate if their particular college grants it.

2. Transfer Portal

- a. Student-athletes can now transfer without any restrictions. Thousands of student-athletes are taking advantage of this opportunity.

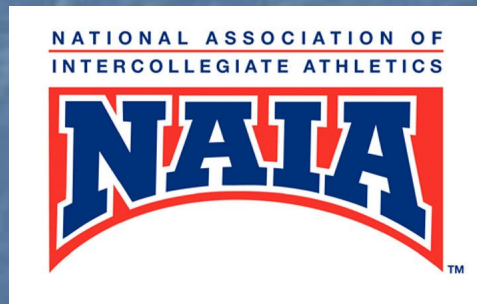

It is important for potential prospects to know the the NCAA Division 1 FBS Football Recruiting Rules. Athletes and coaches have certain restrictions when it comes to college basketball recruiting. Ensure your eligibility by following the NCAA recruiting rules.

As a Senior in High School

Recruiting Tactic	As a Senior
Recruiting Material	You can receive material and information from the coach
Telephone Calls	You can call the coach at your own expense. Coach can call once per week starting September 1st. During contact periods college coaches can call unlimited.
Off-Campus Contact	July 1st prior to senior year (limited to contact periods).
Official Visits	You can start official visits on the opening day of your classes. You get one per college and a maximum of 5 visits to D1 schools and unlimited to D2, D3 and NAIA.
Unofficial visits	Unlimited

Division I Sports

- Course Requirement (16)
- 4 years of English
- 3 years of math (Algebra I or higher)
- 2 years of natural/physical science (1 year of lab if offered)
- 1 year of additional English, math or natural/physical science
- 2 years of social science
- 4 years of additional courses (any area above, foreign language or comparative religion/philosophy)
- **Note:** Ten (10) core courses completed before the seventh semester; seven (7) of the 10 must be in English, math or natural/physical science.
- Test Scores: (ACT/SAT) - waived for class of 2021 due to covid.
- Students must present a corresponding test score and core-course GPA on the sliding scale
- Core Grade-Point Average:
 - Only core courses that appear on the high school's List of NCAA Courses on the NCAA Eligibility Center website (www.eligibilitycenter.org) will be used to calculate your core-course GPA. Use this list as a guide.

Division II Sports

- Division II schools provide growth opportunities through academic achievement, high-level competition and a focus on community engagement.

Division II Sports

- DIVISION II 16 Core Courses
- 3 years of English.
- 2 years of mathematics (Algebra I or higher).
- 2 years of natural/physical science (1 year of lab if offered by high school).
- 3 years of additional English, mathematics or natural/physical science.
- 2 years of social science.
- 4 years of additional courses (from any area above, foreign language or comparative religion/philosophy).
- Test Scores
 - Division II currently requires a minimum SAT score of 820 or an ACT sum score of 68.
 - Beginning August 1, 2018, Division II will use a sliding scale to match test scores and core-course grade-point averages (GPA).

Division III Sports

- Division III schools provide an integrated environment focusing on academic success while offering a competitive athletics environment. If you are planning to attend a Division III school, you do not need to register with the NCAA Eligibility Center.

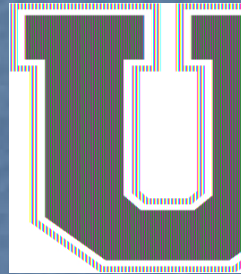

Things to keep in mind

- May replace grade. Have A's and B's.
- Use highest of 16 core course grades
- Must take SAT/ACT
- May use summer courses prior to graduation year
- May take approved college courses

Test Scores

- SAT=Critical Reading and Math (not writing)
- ACT=English + Math +Reading + Science.
- Use highest score in the subtest
- Test scores must be reported directly to the NCAA Eligibility Center by the testing agency.
- Eligibility Center code=9999

Assessing Academic Eligibility

- High school graduate
- Meet specific core course requirements
Upland High School Code: 053586
- Earn a minimum GPA & test scores
(evaluated on a sliding scale)

Academic Eligibility Standards

- NCAA’s way to ensure that all student-athletes are in fact, students *and* athletes.
- There is no academic eligibility requirement for Division III - what the entrance requirements are for that University.

- To Do's:
 - Have a Facebook, Youtube, SnapChat and Instagram accounts.
 - Why? Coaches communicate using these outlets and it lets them know if you are an idiot or worth them talking to you.
 - Post: game highlights, volunteer work, getting "A's" on tests. Example: Special Olympics

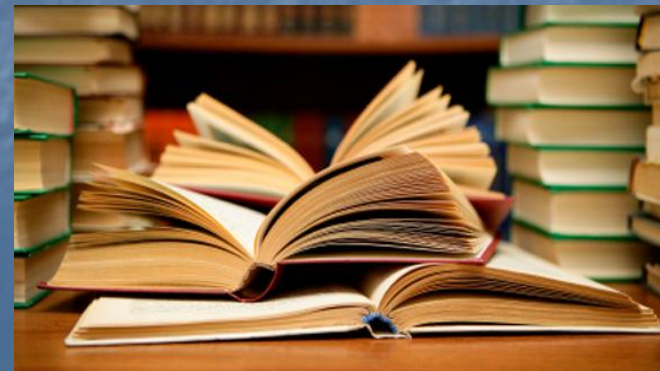
- The DO NOTS:
 - Post inappropriate material
 - Smoking, Drinking, Drugs, etc...
 - Don't re-tweet or like stupid stuff from friends! Then you look as stupid as them

Doing so makes you guilty by association.

Resumes and Cover Letters

- Make them clear and concise.
- Include athletic, academic and extracurricular activities.
- Be school-specific in your letters!
- Email Regularly

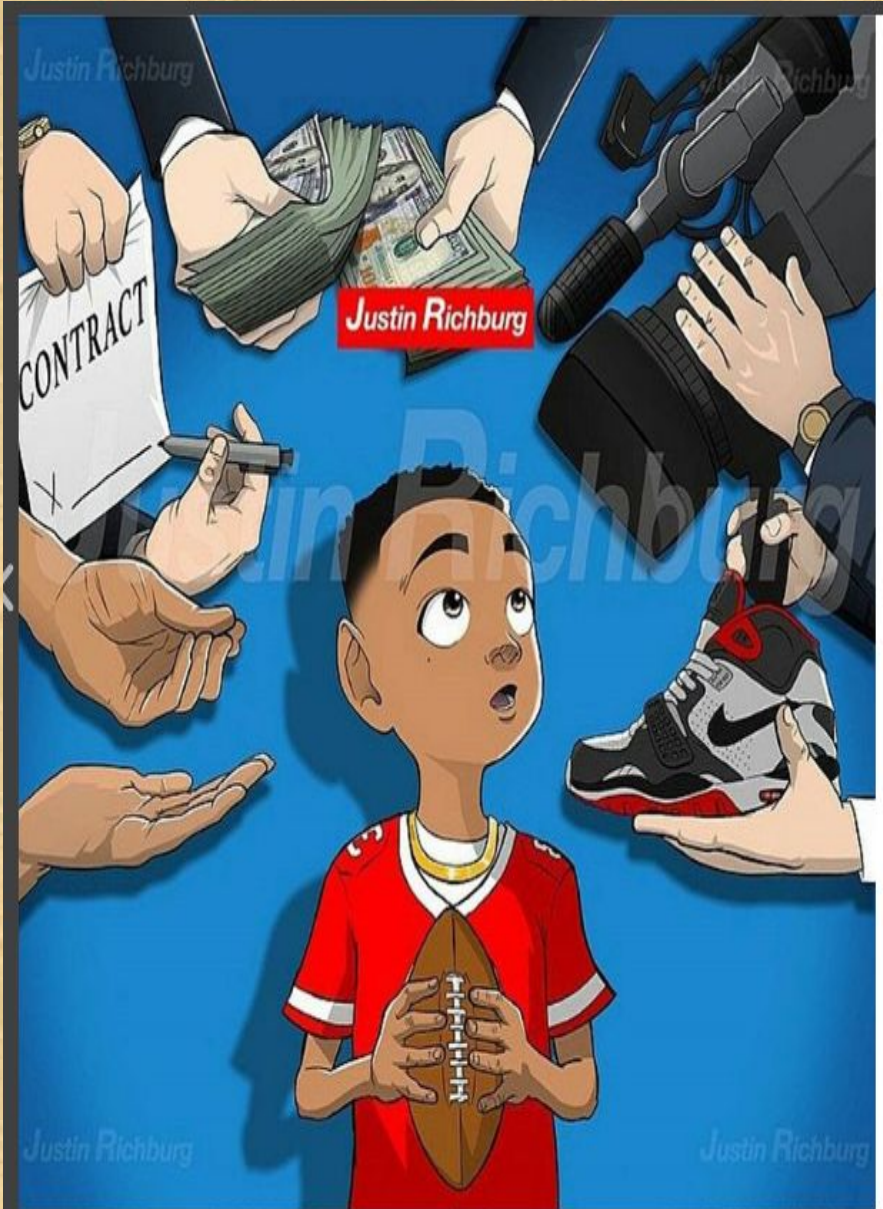

Are Recruiting Services the answer?

As a former college coach, I saw a lot of prospective athletes who paid too much money for recruiting services. It bothered me to see parents throwing money at the process and then sitting back and trusting the recruiting service to get their child into college.

There is a place for tools to help you along the journey, but they don't replace the grit and determination it takes to find a college and roster spot.

I know there are a few coaches who use recruiting services and read the emails that come in the hundreds from recruiting services, but the truth is MOST DON'T.

If not Recruiting Services, then what?

I hope you can see I want to provide enough information to guide you through the entire recruiting process *without spending a penny*.

However, I have also been searching for services and tools that I can recommend to make your job easier. There may be areas you can't handle alone; there may be times it's easier to pay someone than do it all yourself.

I am also in the process of creating online courses to fill in the gaps. More about those coming soon!

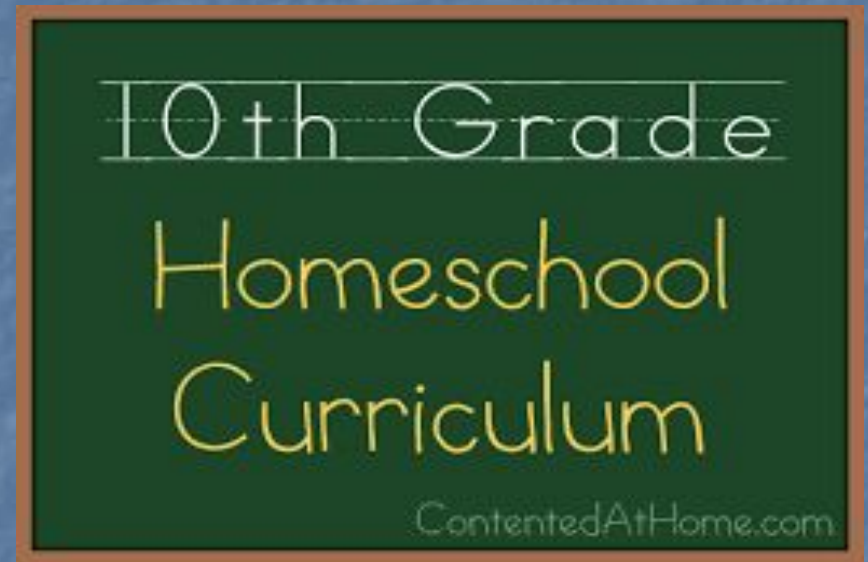
Your Plan

- Grade 9
 - Plan, Plan, Plan
 - Start planning now! Take the right courses and earn the best grades you can
 - Ask your counselor to make a list of NCAA core courses to make sure you are in the right courses.



Your Plan

- Grade 10
- Register
- Register with the NCAA Eligibility Center.
- https://web3.ncaa.org/ecwr3/???links.ncaa-play-college-sports_en_US??
- If you fall behind on courses, don't take shortcuts to catch up...ask your counselor for help



Your Plan

- Grade 11
- Study
- Check with your counselor to make sure you are on track to graduate on time & will meet the NCAA 10/7 rule.
- Take the ACT or SAT and make sure you get your scores
- At the end of the year, ask your counselor to upload your official transcript



Your Plan

- Grade 12
- Graduate
- Take the ACT or SAT again, if necessary
- Request your final amateurism certification after April 1
- After you graduate, ask your counselor to upload your final official transcript with proof of graduation.
